All meetings are free and open to the public.

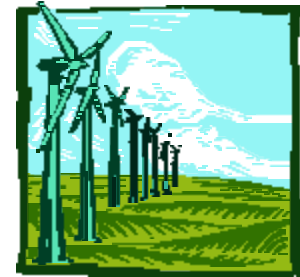

What do the Greens stand for?

The Central Oklahoma Green Party is working to further the four Green Party principles throughout Oklahoma:

Environmental Wisdom: We are working to protect our environment from toxins and carcinogens; to promote recycling; to stop suburban sprawl; to protect green space, trees, and family farms; and to promote public transportation and bike paths.

Social Justice: We are working to guarantee a living wage for all working people; to provide health insurance to all Oklahomans; to end racial discrimination in the criminal justice process; and to guarantee Native American language rights.

Grassroots Democracy: We are working to promote civic participation and voter turnout at the local, state, and national levels.

Non-violence: We are working to end hate crimes and fight police brutality.

Why Join the Greens?

The two major parties are both beholden to corporate contributors and fail to defend social justice and the environment.

Green Party campaigns at the local, state, and national levels enliven public debate and bring about real grassroots change.

As of December, 1999, there are 72 Green Party members holding elective office in 17 states throughout the U.S.

Consumer advocate Ralph Nader and Native American activist Winona LaDuke were the Green Party candidates for U.S. President and Vice President in 1996 and are running again in 2000.

On average, Americans work an additional 163 hours per year, compared to 20 years ago – with less time for family and community.

A majority of workers in the U.S. are making less now, inflation-adjusted, than in 1979.

As of 1999, 76% of new jobs in Oklahoma pay less than a living wage; 13% of families, 38.3% of female headed families, and 21% of children in Oklahoma live in poverty.

Oklahoma's per capita spending on public health and public education are among the lowest in the nation.
